Reflections from the Rector

Recently, a member of the church came up to me and informed me that they had scoured the Book of Common Prayer for the benediction I proclaim at the end of the service. You may remember it:

*Wherever our lives take us this week remember, you never walk alone,
For our Lord Jesus Christ walks in front of you to lead you,
Our Lord Jesus Christ walks behind you to encourage you,
Our Lord Jesus Christ walks above you to guide you,
Our Lord Jesus Christ walks beneath you to support you,
Our Lord Jesus Christ walks beside you to befriend you,
And our Lord Jesus Christ lives/dwells within your heart to give you peace.*

I informed my brother that it was not a benediction found in the Prayer Book but was found in the Celtic tradition of the church. Also, it was the benediction that was pronounced over the student community in Knoxville by my colleague and friend. When I moved to California I could not imagine going from Sunday to Sunday without hearing this truth of God's continued incarnation in my life and so I began to proclaim this truth for us at Good Samaritan.

However, it just so happened, as it so often does for those who look for God in their midst, that after this conversation we went into the healing service and as a part of that service that particular morning we read Psalm 23. Now this psalm is familiar to many of us and one that is sung often by faithful people. And as we read it that

morning I saw a familiar benediction within the Psalm. I think you will see what I mean:

*The Lord is my SHEPHERD;
I shall not be in want.
He makes me lie down in green pastures
And LEADS me beside still waters.
He REVIVES my soul
And GUIDES me along right pathways for his Name's sake.
Though I WALK through the valley of the shadow of death,
I shall fear no evil;
For YOU ARE WITH ME;
your rod and your staff, they COMFORT me.
You spread a table BEFORE me in the presence of those who trouble me;
You have anointed my HEAD with oil,
And my cup is running over.
Surely your goodness and mercy shall FOLLOW me all the days of my life,
And I will DWELL in the house of the Lord forever.*

Apparently the Irish and Scots had a similar knowledge, understanding and experience of God as that of David's, that God was in the midst of their lives and their companion on the journey. May we continue to walk in the knowledge, understanding and experience that God is our companion wherever we find ourselves on the journey of life.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report Summary of April 2009 Financial Activity of Operating Fund

Income	\$ 51,966	\$ 240,210
Expenses	\$ 40,912	\$ 228,006
Operating increase / (decrease)	\$ 11,054	\$ 12,204

Our income during May was very good. The offering income was about \$2,800 more than we had expected, but this number seems to fluctuate from month to month. Another source of extra income was the two couples reserving our facilities for weddings (congratulations to them!).

Our expenses for May also helped the bottom line in that they were more than \$4,000 less than we had anticipated.

Overall, our income was more than our expenses by about \$11,054. This brings our income for the year to \$12,204 more than our expenses. That's the way I like to see it!

See the separate article by Arthur Kassebaum. We are now about \$12,000 in the black for the year, having more income than expenditures to the end of May.

Rector's Report

The Bishop will be with us on Sept. 27th, at a single service, followed by a meeting with the vestry.

We'll have 3 guest preachers during the summer, Mike Angel, Lawrence Waddy, and Will Fisher. Chris will be here for each of those Sundays.

The Diocese will not be able to partner with Good Sam for a position of campus minister/ Good Sam Associate Minister because they have been reorganizing and money is tight. We will look at our campus ministry mission again so we don't lose our momentum. Meanwhile the campus ministry will continue its presence at UCSD with an interim minister until July 1 and another person who will help out during fall quarter.

Chris has received comments about the security article that was in the May issue of The Tidings. The vestry endorsed installation of security improvements including fire doors, a buzzer system and signage to separate the church offices from the sanctuary. and motion sensor lights around Roetter Hall. The Admin fractal is working on a security and safety procedure.

Sr. Warden's Report

Sr. Warden Carol Hamilton has met with the chairs of the various committees within the church, and the committee process (a part of the "program church" model of organization) is working.

Jr. Warden's Report

Jr. Warden Dave Miller and others held a Christian Education family

meeting in focus group style with families of young children. The parents are dedicated to their spirituality and the importance of Good Sam. It is very important to them that their children learn facts in a Bible-based Sunday school. This is a good Christian Education beginning with a strong group of parents.

Music Director Position Update

In June two candidates will rehearse with and lead the choir at a Sunday service. Both candidates are local, both play piano and organ, and both have experience leading choirs. The music director search committee will make the hiring decision, with input from the choirs, vestry, and others.

2009 Budget Committee Holds Midyear Review

On June 23rd the 2009 budget Committee met to review the 2009 budget to date and begin the planning for the 2010 Budget process.

Treasurer Arthur Kassebaum reported that income and expenses are pretty much what we had projected. Our income exceeds our expenses at this point by approximately \$2000. In spite of the challenging economy, only two pledges have been revised downward. Good Sam did receive a one-time gift of \$10,000 which was placed in the operating fund.

Progress is being made on converting our construction loan to a mortgage. Arthur hopes that will be accomplished in July.

The Vestry has scheduled the annual series of **Home Forums for August 25-28 and August 30th**. This opportunity for all members of the parish to discuss their visions for the future of Good Sam is the first step in

the development of the 2010 budget.

The second step is a series of three **Budget Hearings**. Between the services on **October 18th**, members of the congregation will have the opportunity to share their priorities with the Vestry, the Budget Committee and each other. On **November 1st** parishioners will see what resources that “Dream Budget” would require. The Stewardship Campaign will culminate with the Ingathering on **November 15th**. Then, on **December 13th**, we’ll see what can actually be included in the budget with the resources available (Reality Budget).

The final step of the budget process comes when the Vestry approves a Budget for 2010 in January and presents it to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on January 17, 2010.

With Arthur’s help, the Vestry and the Budget Committee are beginning to look at some longer-range projections for the next 3 to 5 years. Issues such as staffing needs, support for the diocese and parish growth and development are a part of the discussion.

2009 Christmas Boutique Coordinator Needed

The Christmas Boutique has been an annual event for Good Samaritan for a number of years. At this time, no one has stepped forward to coordinate the 2009 event. We need a coordinator or co-chairs identified by September 1st if this event is to take place in 2009.

The boutique takes place the first weekend in December, the 5th and 6th this year. On Saturday it is open to the public from 9:00-2:00 and Sunday for our parish between the worship

services. Sometimes in the past it has been held with a rummage sale. If this is the case, a rummage sale co-chairman would be necessary.

The duties of the coordinator are as follows:

- Organize a Christmas Boutique Committee and conduct meetings as necessary.

- Contact each ministry in the church to see if they want to have a table for the sale. Ministries participating in the past have been: Altar and Flower Guild, Helping Hands, Women's Group, Daughters of the King, Youth, and Antiques and Collectibles, gift basket auction and raffle. (Ministries keep the money that they raise or they can donate to the main designated use of the funds) Decide on a use for the funds raised.

- Other people needed to assist the coordinator: treasurer, publicity, table set-up and layout (includes signs for each table, decorations), cleanup

- Keep the Good Sam and Tidings information ongoing for 2 months previous to the event giving names of ministry contacts and their needs.

- 3 weeks prior to event, put up banners at the church and on fence at Hwy. 52, and flood area with posters in libraries, supermarkets, etc. other churches in the area. Parishioners can help with this. Call Salvation Army for a pick-up of unsold items after the sale at 1-800-958-7825

- 3 weeks prior to the event provide a sign-up after church for help with table set-up, setting out items, clean-up and take down, cashiers for both days, Rovers who assist customers and carry out packages and bag items for cashiers.

- Following the event prepare a brief summary of the financial and operational results of the day. Include recommendations for future coordinators.

Mary Mathis (858-457-2508) and Diana Davis (858-271-1890) have

offered to answer any questions you might have as you prayerfully consider this ministry.

Are You Prepared?

All baptized Christians are called to be active participants in the church's ministry. Have you ever felt you weren't prepared, or didn't know what your ministry should be?

Have you ever wanted to know more about the faith? Would you like to acquire tools to help you decide on a ministry or support you in that ministry? Would you be encouraged by belonging to a small group (6 to 12) of committed people who meet weekly for 9 months under the direction of a trained mentor for study, theological reflection, and prayer? If so, EfM is calling you!

Education for Ministry (EfM) is a basic theological education in scripture, church history, liturgy, and theology. It teaches you to think theologically and provides you with a new confidence to be Christ's minister. The course is administered by the School of Theology of University of the South. It is a four year program but you sign up one year at a time.

St. Peter's, Del Mar is beginning a new class in September. St Peter's has run EfM for over 20 years. Fellow Good Sammers currently taking the course include Margaret Bookwalter, Robin Fowler, and the Shawlers. A recent graduate of the program is Germaine Bergeron-Lynn.

Feel free to ask any of them questions as well as the coordinator of the program at St. Peter's, Mary Wavrik. The cost is \$340 a year. General Convention

The General Convention of The Episcopal Church is held every three years. This year it is in Anaheim, California from July 8-17.

It's a chance to talk about big church issues. From issues that have been splintering the denomination, to practical issues like the budget.

Here are some of the Resolutions:

Worship and Liturgy

- A report called "Rachel's Tears, Hannah's Hopes: Liturgies and Prayers for Healing from Loss Related to Childbearing and Childbirth."
- An overhaul of Lesser Feasts and Fasts, adding names to the Church Calendar.
- Requests for authorization to

develop rites of blessing for same-gender unions

- Use of gender-neutral language for prayer book marriage services; creation of an Episcopal Relief and Development Sunday; liturgical materials for a new Creation Cycle to be celebrated during the season after Pentecost

Economic Justice issues

- Program to alleviate poverty in the U.S.; increased ministry to native peoples
- Formation of an economic justice ministry for and with lower-income people
- Increased efforts to combat racism within the Church
- Increased advocacy with the U.S. government and other countries to combat poverty, disease and violations of human rights.

Anglican Communion

- Discussion of the proposed Anglican covenant
- Requests to overturn GC06 Resolution B033, which called for restraint in electing bishops "whose manner of life presents a challenge to the wider church"
- Ecumenical & Interreligious Relations
- Proposal for full communion with the Moravian Church, and moving toward full communion with the (Lutheran) Church of Sweden

Want to see how these turn out?

Anaheim is not that far away. Registration is closed, but you can show up at Hall C in the Anaheim Convention Center starting July 6th to register. Onsite visitors fee is \$60, but if you want all the legislative material it is \$400, or you can volunteer. Check out the website for more information: <http://ecusa.anglican.org/gc2009.htm>

Good Samaritans of the Month

The **RRR** (Ruth the Roving Reporter) first met Anne Fowler and Chris Smith a year ago when we were having the home forums. We were all chatting about church, and the direction we were taking. It was also a wonderful way for us to get to know each other. This summer month of July, we are catching up with Anne and Chris as they are getting ready for their wedding at Good Sam on August 22! Anne is one of Robin Fowler's 2 daughters.

(RRR) So, are you just frantic with the wedding?

(Anne) Oh, I am. There are days! Chris is not, though. So, he grounds me. We are having the wedding and rehearsal dinner here at Good Sam. But, the reception is at the Handlery.

(RRR) We love weddings at Good Sam! Bob and I were married here by Fr. Sanders, 15 years ago. Your dad and his wife, Jeanie met at Good Sam, and they were married in 2001. This was after your mom had passed away. In fact, both Jeanie and Robin's spouses passed away, and are buried here in our Memorial Garden. So, when did you and your family start coming to Good Sam?

(Anne) I was baptized at Good Sam. I have memories of Good Sam when I was 6 or 7. But, we were there most likely earlier, when I was still a baby. We had just moved to University City. 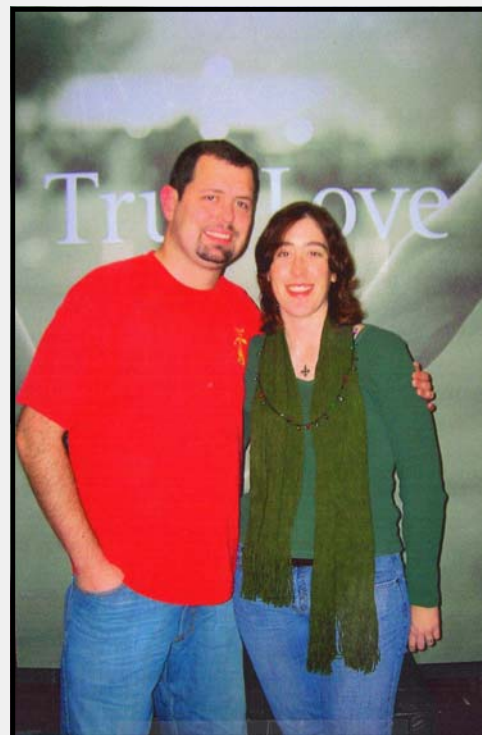
